#### **Jude 1-4**

For certain individuals whose condemnation was written about long ago have secretly slipped in among you. They are ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into a license for immorality and deny Jesus Christ our only Sovereign and Lord. Though you already know all this, I want to remind you that the Lord at one time delivered his people out of Egypt, but later destroyed those who did not believe. And the angels who did not keep their positions of authority but abandoned their proper dwelling—these he has kept in darkness, bound with everlasting chains for judgment on the great Day. In a similar way, Sodom and Gomorrah and the surrounding towns gave themselves up to sexual immorality and perversion. They serve as an example of those who suffer the punishment of eternal fire.

In the very same way, on the strength of their dreams these ungodly people pollute their own bodies, reject authority and heap abuse on celestial beings. But even the archangel Michael, when he was disputing with the devil about the body of Moses, did not himself dare to condemn him for slander but said, "The Lord rebuke you!" Yet these people slander whatever they do not understand, and the very things they do understand by instinct—as irrational animals do—will destroy them. Woe to them! They have taken the way of Cain; they have rushed for profit into Balaam's error; they have been destroyed in Korah's rebellion. These people are blemishes at your love feasts, eating with you without the slightest qualm—shepherds who feed only themselves. They are clouds without rain, blown along by the wind; autumn trees, without fruit and uprooted—twice dead. They are wild waves of the sea, foaming up their shame; wandering stars, for whom blackest darkness has been reserved forever. Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied about them: "See, the Lord is coming with thousands upon thousands of his holy

ones to judge everyone, and to convict all of them of all the ungodly acts they have committed in their ungodliness, and of all the defiant words ungodly sinners have spoken against him." These people are grumblers and faultfinders; they follow their own evil desires; they boast about themselves and flatter others for their own advantage.



The truth is always the truth, but sometimes people might try and change it a little to suit themselves. But, the truth can't be changed, it is the truth!!



These are to guide the general conversation.

- 1. Have you ever told a lie?
- 2. Have you ever been told a lie or a little fib? How did you feel?
- 3. What is one truth you know about Jesus?
- 4. What does it mean to you to know Jesus is the truth that never changes?



## **CRAFT ACTIVITY**

#### THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE

The saying goes 'the truth will set you free'. That is true for us, Jesus is the truth and He sets us free and allows us to be friends with God. What are some truths you know about God?

### You Will Need:

- Key printout (at the end of the guide)
- Textas, pencils or crayons.
- String.

As a family discuss some truths you know about Jesus and your friendship with Him. Write each one down on a key. Once you are done colour them in and cut them out. Make a small hole in each key and string them together, like a keyring. Place your truth keys somewhere you can read them together as a family to remind each other of the truth of Jesus!



### **ACTIVE ACTIVITY**

#### TRUTH OR NOT

Jesus says "I am the Truth" which means we can trust everything He says. It also means that Jesus truth will never change!!!



#### You Will Need:

- Paper Plates
- Cones or something to throw rings onto
- 'Truth or Not' statements (at the end of the guide)

Before you play this game you will need to write the 'Truth or Not' Statements on the outside of the paper plates and cut out the middles to make rings. On one cone (or whatever you are using) place a label 'Yes' and on the other a label 'No'. Read the statement on the paper plate and then decide if it is truth or not. If it is try and throw it to land on the 'Yes' cone If it is not the truth try and land it on the 'No' cone.



Jesus, we thank you that you are the truth! We thank you that you never change, your word is always truth! Help us to know and understand who you are and who we are because of your love for us. Help us also to share your truth with those around us. In your name we pray, Amen.



Name, in Christ alone you can stand against every evil threat. Amen


# **COMMUNITY CONNECTION**
