#4 Wholehearted Submission





Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Luke 9:62 (Full Text – Luke 9:51-62)



Jesus wants you to submit all your life to him. Not only your eternal life, but also your life right here and now.

There is a scene, in the 2012 Marvel movie, 'Avengers', where one of the villains (Loki) is trying to threaten a group of civilians and he tells them this,

"Is this not simpler? Is this not your natural state? It's the unspoken truth of humanity, that you crave subjugation. The bright lure of freedom diminishes your life's joy in a mad scramble for power, for identity. You were made to be ruled. In the end, you will always kneel."

While that sounds pretty confronting, there is actually something Biblical about that claim. We were never created to be independent rulers. We were created to work with God, under his leadership and authority. It is when Adam and Even rejected that authority and sought to take that place for themselves that things started going wrong. We were in fact, made to serve God; not as slaves, but also not as equals. The problem being that if we are not prepared to 'kneel' before our loving heavenly Father and serve him, then Loki is right, we inevitably end up serving something else that does not have our best interests at heart.

Read the Luke 9:51-62 here, or in your own Bible.

- 5. Try to summarise the main idea of this passage.
- 6. What verse/concept/teaching in this reading caught your attention and what was challenging/confronting/comforting about it for you?
- 7. The beginning of this chapter, the 12 disciples have been sent out by Jesus with Jesus' power and authority to cast out demons, cure all kinds of diseases, and proclaim the kingdom of God. Now at the end of the chapter, James and John want to use that power to call down 'fire from heaven' on Jesus' enemies. What crucial thing did they do to avoid making that mistake?
- 8. In the second part of this reading, many people claim to want to follow Jesus, but they want to deal with other things first. What is Jesus response to their requests? What point do you think Jesus is trying to make?



Part of what Jesus is getting at in his response to all those who want to follow him, but feel they have to put other affairs in order first, is that if your life does become about following Jesus, real wholehearted following, then his priorities have to become yours. You can't follow Jesus and be looking back over your shoulder all the time at the sin, attitudes, misconceptions and lies that he asks you to leave behind.

It seems that many Christians today, want to follow Jesus but only on their terms. They want a God who will help them when they need him but stay out of their lives when they have everything under control for themselves. To put it another way, many Christians want a God whom they are happy to trust with their 'eternal life' but who they would rather stay out of their life right now. But Jesus is telling us to put our entire lives into his hands and to put all our effort into following him.

- 9. Go back to the Loki quote at the top of the page. What things about it ring true for you about humanity and your own experience of it? What would change if we accepted the power and identity which Jesus has offered to each of us through his death and resurrection, rather than 'scrambling' to achieve and define those things for ourselves which we already have in Christ?
- 10. Jesus used the analogy of looking back while working a plough. It's maybe not a metaphor that connects with all us urbanised city folk. But the problem was that your ploughed rows would not be straight unless you fixed your eyes on a spot directly in front of you. You would inevitably end up 'off track'. What might be a modern day image or example that might communicate a similar truth?



MAKE IT REAL:

It can be easy to miss the parts of our lives that we have not submitted to Jesus, especially when life is going smoothly. It's also easy to miss when the parts we have not submitted are things like attitudes or things that we haven't done as opposed to the obvious things which we do that everyone else can see. The other mistake people make when it comes to following Jesus is that they feel they have to sort these things out before they will be accepted by Christ. Our reading today shows us that even if there are things in your life that need sorting out, Jesus invites you to follow him first, and then trust him to help you work it all out along the way.

- 11. What is one part of your life that you do not think you have not fully submitted to the Lordship of Jesus?
- 12. What things (guilt, shame, fear, etc) do you think might be things that still hold you back from following Jesus 100%?
- 13. What is one practical thing you can do this week to help you submit those things to Jesus more completely?
