- 1. Where have you seen God moving in your life in the last week?
- 2. Share how you went with your living purposefully from last time?
- 3. If you could explore anywhere in the world, where would you like to explore and why?
- 4. At the present time, would you say spiritually that you a) have given up and are packing up the nets?b) in the boat but wonder if there is really a point, or c) ready to explore new horizons? Share reasons.

Most of the breakthrough discoveries and remarkable inventions throughout history are the result of curiosity. They come from a willingness to have a go, to risk failure, to do something differently & explore novel possibilities. Curiosity seems natural to a child, but with age and our experience of mistakes and embarrassment, too many people get stuck between curiosity and a desire for security and predictability. "Risk" is not a word that appears in our vocabulary or is nurtured in our character. Jesus places no limit on what his Church can do, but instead points to the greater challenge, the higher risk, the deeper water of the unknown to discover his grace, power & abundance that transforms the world and our lives in the process.

Worship series BEYOND LIMITS: A Kingdom Horizon (#1 in series)





When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

Luke 5:4



Jesus is calling us deeper and further, where the catch is guaranteed.



Read Luke 5:1-11

One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God. ² He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat.

⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

⁶ When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. ⁷ So they signalled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink.

⁸ When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" ⁹ For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, ¹⁰ and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners.

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." ¹¹ So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

- 5. What words or phrases capture your attention?
- 6. What questions do you have? What makes you curious?
- 7. What do you learn about God in this text?
- 8. Where might God's Spirit be nudging you?



There is so much about this story that is "Beyond Limits" – it is the wrong time of day to go fishing (they normally went at night, when the fish swam closer to shore). The nets they used were designed for fishing in the shallows, they weren't designed for deeper waters. It was crazy to row into deeper waters in the hope of catching fish that were out of reach.

- 9. Where in your life do you feel like have "been fishing all night and caught nothing"? Consider the people that you have been praying for? What might God be telling you about that?
- 10. How do you respond when you think God is asking you to do something that doesn't make sense or seems impossible?
- 11. Where is the deeper, unknown, not right water, not right time that maybe Jesus is calling you to row out to today?
- 12. How would you explain Peter's response (v8) to Jesus after catching so many fish?

Discipleship, following Jesus, is meant to be transforming, it disrupts our lives, it takes us in a new direction, it costs us something. Many people have met Jesus by the lake, but are not willing to leave behind those things that matter to them so that they can embrace what matters to Jesus.

13. What is the "everything" in verse 11 for you at this moment and what would it look like for you to act in obedience to Jesus' call?



When we engage in God's activity, things that were once considered impossible become possible. In this account, the nets were stretched to the point of breaking and the boats were filled to the point of sinking. There is generosity, there is abundance, there is a guaranteed catch when we are willing to respond to Jesus' call. Jesus wants to engage us in his Kingdom mission; to show us a new horizon that is beyond the limits of our understanding and planning. He calls us to be obedient in the little things so he can show us the deeper and further things.

At LifeWay, we have a Vision 2030 strategy (see picture to the right) that is about a journey toward a Kingdom horizon that is beyond the limits of our understanding, beyond the limits of what we cannot see, beyond the limits of what we think is possible. That's the point.

What part may Jesus be calling you to fulfil in this plan? (Remember the waypoints are not prescriptive or exhaustive. What is the deeper, further place that he may be calling you toward this Kingdom horizon which will fulfil his purpose for you?

14. Choose one area where you feel the Spirit nudging you to go deeper. Share it with the group. What's one practical step you can take before you meet next time to go a little further?



- Praise God for calling you to participate in his mission and be fishers of people.
- Thank Jesus for his willingness to descend into the depths of hell to give us a new beginning and purpose.
- Ask the Holy Spirit for courage to go into deeper water and let down our nets when we are tempted to give up.
- Pray for the gathering of Indian students that will meet with Pastor Mark to go deeper in the Word and the life of Jesus.
- Pray for comfort for David Hill and his family as they mourn the sudden loss of David's son this past week.
- Pray for the LifeWay Vision 2030 Beyond Limits strategy, that we might be bold for the Lord and trusting the leading of the Spirit as he pushes us out into deeper water.
- Pray for the Northern Territory communities hit by flooding in the last week
- Check the prayer list in LifeWay News and pray accordingly.
- Anything else that comes to mind!
