Read Revelation 21:1-7; 22:1-7

Then I saw "a new heaven and a new earth," [a] for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. ² I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. ³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ⁴ 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' [b] or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."

⁵ He who was seated on the throne said, "I am making everything new!" Then he said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true."

⁶ He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To the thirsty I will give water without cost from the spring of the water of life. ⁷ Those who are victorious will inherit all this, and I will be their God and they will be my children.

^{22:1}Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, as clear as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb ² down the middle of the great street of the city. On each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing twelve crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month. And the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations. ³ No longer will there be any curse. The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in the city, and his servants will serve him. ⁴ They will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. ⁵ There will be no more night. They will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun, for the Lord God will give them light. And they will reign for ever and ever.

⁶ The angel said to me, "These words are trustworthy and true. The Lord, the God who inspires the prophets, sent his angel to show his servants the things that must soon take place."

⁷ "Look, I am coming soon! Blessed is the one who keeps the words of the prophecy written in this scroll."

- 12. Martin Luther in the Large Catechism says: "On the other hand, when people become Christians, the old person in them gets smaller each day until he's completely gone." Baptism... (LC, 182). How are you seeing the old person get smaller in your life each day...or if it isn't, what is stopping that?
- 13. Have a go at retelling Revelation 21:1-7; and 22:1-7 in your own words.

PRAY intentionally

- Praise God for his patience and love in our lives, restoring, reviving and giving us a new purpose in life.
- Thank Jesus for coming from heaven to give us life now.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to give you courage to live fully now, knowing that he is making all things new in your life!
- Pray for a heart of faith that can see the beauty and best in what God is doing in this world and in people's lives and for the boldness to call out that beauty for others to see.
- Pray for the Church that it may be an anchor of certainty for those who feel uncertain in life.
- Pray for our newly elected government, that they may be part of God's restoring, renewing work in this world.
- Pray for each other that we may live by these final words of life from Jesus.
- Ask the Father to give you someone (or two or three) to pray for, asking the Father to draw them to him. (John 6:44,45)
- Ask the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into his harvest, remembering you might be the very answer to the prayer that you pray.
