- 10. While God is not mentioned in this book, where do you see God's intervention and providence being worked out in these chapters?



- 11. How did Mordecai respond to the injustice, evil and corruption he sees around him?
- 12. How do we respond individually and as a Church to injustice, evil and corruption we see happening around us and how could we respond differently?
- 13. Re-read Mordecai's speech in 4:12-14. What does it tell you about his faith? How is it similar to Joseph's words in Genesis 50:20 and what encouragement does that give to you?
- 14. How do Esther's actions point to Jesus and the things he will do for us?
