Worship series: Pandemic of Joy #1 Thankful Joy





## **VERSE** for the week

I thank God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now.

> Key Verse: Philippians 1:3-5 Full Text: Philippians 1



Thankful joy finds blessing in every circumstance and rejoices in proclaiming Jesus.

- 4. Retell the passage in your own words.
- 5. What verse/concept/teaching in this reading caught your attention and what was challenging/confronting/comforting about it for you?
- 6. In this reading are some of the Apostle Paul's most famous words, "For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain". What do you think Paul meant by this and how might that kind of thinking be connected to his joy?



What is pretty clear in this passage is that Paul's joy is not diminished by the fact that he is currently in prison. Joy, unlike happiness, should not be effected by our circumstances.

- 7. Look carefully through the text again, what are the kinds of things that Paul rejoices about?
- 8. Where do you see connections in this passage between joy and thanksgiving? How do you think thankfulness (or lack of it) affects our experience of joy?
- 9. What role do you think thankfulness and joy have to play in "conducting ourselves in a manner worthy of our calling"?



#### **MAKE IT REAL:**

Paul ends this chapter of his letter to the Philippian Christians, by encouraging them to conduct themselves in a manner worthy of their calling – whatever happens. We all know that life rarely goes the way we would like or expect it to. When this happens we tend to focus on the situation and circumstances that are less ideal than the ones we hoped for. Doing this will quickly sap our jo and thankfulness. Paul instead seem to focus on the outcomes. He sees God at work in his own captivity in his captors coming to faith in Christ and going on to proclaim Jesus themselves. He hears of the faithful witness to Jesus of the Christians in Philippi, he rejoices, even at wrongly motivated preaching – provided that they are teaching and proclaiming Christ.

- 10. What are some of the circumstances you may be facing that are obstructing your joy and thankfulness and your ability to see what God is doing with you at the moment?
- 11. Have you ever experienced the joy of helping lead someone else to faith in Jesus. It can be both an incredibly frustrating but equally joyful experience. How will you take seriously the call to 'partner together in the gospel' and experience the joy of doing that in your life?
- 12. What are three things that you can be thankful of that won't change with your circumstances?

This week, I want to invite your LifeGroup to conduct an experiment. Let's try practicing thankfulness. Spend some time each day simply thinking of three things to give thanks to God for. You might consider keeping a record of how your mood and level of joy changes throughout the week/fortnight as you practice this kind of thankfulness and share your findings with your group next time you meet.
