Worship series: Discipleship Begins With A 'W' #3 -'Ways'



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#### **VERSE** for the week

Show me your ways, Lord, teach me your paths. Guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Saviour, and my hope is in you all day long.

#### Key Verses: Psalm 25:4-5

Full Text: Psalm 25:4-7



Jesus transforms our hearts so that grace creates a place for others.



Psalm 25 reminds us that there is good in doing things God's way, and that is because our God is a good God. Read **Mark 9:30-37** in your own Bible or online at Bible Gateway <u>HERE</u>

- 5. Retell the passage in your own words.
- 6. What verse/concept/teaching in this reading caught your attention and what was challenging/confronting/comforting about it for you?
- 7. What do you notice from this story about the way the disciples were arguing and the way Jesus addressed their dispute? How might this inform our own practice or behaviour as a group of Jesus disciples?
- 8. What do you think is special or significant about Jesus using children as an illustration here?



We love stories like this one where we see the 12 disciples following Jesus, walking with him down the road to Capernaum. They are walking the physical path that Jesus is setting out for them and yet they still don't get it; they still can't see what Jesus is really on about. They don't understand the **way** that Jesus does things or the **way** things work in the Kingdom of Heaven. We love them because they give us hope when we know we have failed to act on or understand what Jesus has wanted us to do, that all is not lost. These 12 men who didn't get it, are still the ones God used to establish the Church on earth.

- 9. How would you describe the way that Jesus is setting before the disciples in this passage?
- 10. Have you ever had an experience of looking at your life and being left with the question, "God what are you doing? What are you trying to teach/show me through this?" How did God answer that question for you? Do you still feel that the answer is not clear?
- 11. If we said the '*way*' Jesus puts to his disciples here is a way of humility and service, how do you see humility and services being linked or connected to trust and obedience?



#### MAKE IT REAL:

Living the *way* of Jesus is about living a life modelled on how Jesus lived and also on what Jesus taught. Jesus showed us a way of humility – he did not consider his status as the Son of God something to be used to his own advantage (Philippians 2:5-11). Instead, he used and lived his life in service to others and in humble obedience to the will of the Father, even to the point of his death on the cross. Sometimes as Christians, we can behave like the disciples, arguing and bickering among ourselves about whose theology, or Bible knowledge or devotional life is the best. It happens between individuals and also between different churches.

- 12. What kind of impact do you think that kind of behaviour has on the way the rest of the world views us 1. as Christians, 2. the church as Gods people, 3. God himself?
- 13. The way of Jesus is very different to the way of the world. How easy would it be for someone to recognise you as someone who walks the way or Jesus?
