

- 1. Highs and lows for the week.
- 2. Accountability time. How did you go with your living purposefully from last time?
- 3. When it comes to jumping in the pool or surf, are you a 'dip your toe in', 'wade up to your waist' or an 'all in' kind of person? Does it depend on the circumstances?
- 4. What is something in your life that you have gone all in on? Why did you go all in?

There's nothing quite like it. Those days when temperatures are high, bodies are overheated, energy is sapped and patience is low. Desperation is in the air. Anything to get some relief: a pool, the beach. There is no tentative dipping in of the toes...it's all in. You have to submerge completely to get the full impact, and how transforming it is. That first gasp of air when returning to the surface is filled with freedom, energy and a renewed spirit. That's what grace is like. When you are totally immersed in the revitalising waters of God's unfailing grace, it will transform every part, every relationship in your life. So don't hold back...go all in and experience the joy and delight of the one who went all in for you. Jesus Christ.



- 5. How would you explain 'grace' to someone who doesn't have any idea what the word means? What does "grace" mean to you?
- 6. How does this passage help you understand what grace is all about?
- 7. What do you think it means when John writes, "you have received grace in place of grace already received" or as another translation says, "Grace upon grace"?
- 8. Grace is scandalous. It's hard to accept. Hard to believe. Hard to receive. What is it about grace that is hardest for you to understand or really grasp?



The word grace is commonly used these days. We talk about the bank or the electricity company giving us a grace period. We talk about politicians, business or church leaders falling from grace. We describe an actress as gracious or a dancer as being graceful. We say grace before a meal, or even call our children by that name. As a Church we talk about "grace alone", we sing songs about it, most pastors preach on it, but it still remains a mystery for people. So what is grace? Theologian John Stott says.

"Grace is God loving, God stooping, God coming to the rescue, God giving himself generously in and through Jesus Christ."

9. Do you think this is a good definition of grace? Why or why not?

Read Ephesians 24-10

- 10. How does Stott's definition above match up with Paul's word's in Ephesians 2? Why is grace a gift?
- 11. What were you like before you are immersed in grace, and what are you like after receiving grace according to these verses?

Grace is God's undeserved favour toward sinners. There is nothing in you and nothing you do that moves God to forgive you. God is gracious to us because of Jesus Christ and because of Him alone. Paul tells us in Ephesians 1:7 (NLT): He is so rich in kindness and grace that he purchased our freedom with the blood of his Son and forgave our sins. See also Romans 3:24-25 (New Living Translation). Luther in his explanation to the second article of the Apostles' Creed says this:


I believe that Jesus Christ – true God, son of the Father from eternity, and also true human being, born of the Virgin Mary – is my Lord.

At great cost he has saved and redeemed me, a lost and condemned person.

He has freed me from sin, death and the power of the devil,

not with silver or gold, but with his holy and precious blood and his innocent suffering and death. All this he has done that I may be his own, live under him in his kingdom and serve him in everlasting righteousness, innocence and blessedness, just as he is risen from the dead and lives and rules eternally.

This is most certainly true.



- 12. How have you been changed/shaped/bowled over by God's unrelenting grace in your life?
- 13. How would your life be different if you could confidently say and believe "I am the one God loves?" Do vou believe it?
- 14. When it comes to your Christian faith, where would you consider that you are at right now? A toe in the water, up to your waist, or all in and fully immersed in God's grace? Explain.
- 15. What prevents you from going all in when it comes to a relationship with Jesus Christ? What needs to change to help you jump in and splash around in God's grace?
- 16. How can the LifeGroup give you a gentle push so you jump in boots and all to the grace God wants to immerse your life in?
- Praise God for holding nothing back but going all in so you could have an eternal relationship with him. Thank Jesus for coming all in to the mess of this world to rescue you and fill your life with his overflowing stream of grace. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you daily immerse yourselves in the waters of baptism that you may know with certainty that you belong to him.
- Pray that your splashing around joyfully in God's grace in life may be the cause for others asking how they can get wet and join in the delight of being immersed in God's grace.
- For those who are struggling with identity or self-worth, that they may be able to say, "I am the one God loves."

Turn to the person next to you and make the sign of the cross on the palm of their hand or forehead as you say: *Name*, may you splash around daily in God's grace. Amen.
