Luke 1:68-79

- "Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come to his people and redeemed them.
- ⁶⁹ He has raised up a horn of salvation for us
 - in the house of his servant David
- ⁷⁰ (as he said through his holy prophets of long ago),
 ⁷¹ salvation from our enemies
- and from the hand of all who hate us—
- ⁷² to show mercy to our ancestors and to remember his holy covenant,
- ⁷³ the oath he swore to our father Abraham:

Advent is a time of self-reflection and self-examination. It's a beautiful time that is supposed to run counter culturally to what we normally experience at this time of the year in terms of busyness and living life at a frantic pace. The word of God did not come to the palaces and main offices of the powers that be. It came in the wilderness. It did not come to the emperor, the governor, the rulers, or the high priests. It came to a wild man, a prophet, a voice crying in the wilderness. Perhaps when we are so buy preparing to live our own lives we are deaf to hearing the voice of God that speaks to us.
