#4 Christmas is Love





"But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit."

Matthew 1:20



We embrace God's gift of love by accepting the risk of loving as he has loved us.

"I love Christmas!" It's the cry of almost every child as they anticipate the arrival of Santa Claus and all his presents. You may even hear some adults say something similar as they excitedly go 'all out' to make sure their house outshines the neighbours with Christmas lights or as they bake their family's favourite Christmas goodies or prepare a delicious Christmas lunch. But that's not the kind of love Christmas is all about.

That kind of love is simply a positive emotional response to an external stimulus. The love that God demonstrates to us at Christmas is something much deeper. It begins as a choice in the face of opposition. It's a choice which moves God, and Joseph, beyond the demands of the law and into new territory. It's a choice to sacrifice a rightful claim to justice and revenge and instead move toward the people or things that stand against you with mercy and kindness despite the risk of pain and rejection.

So read **Matthew 1:18-25** <u>HERE</u> or in your own Bible and then reflect on what this passage shows us about love.

- 4. Try to summarise the main idea of these passages.
- 5. What verse/concept/teaching in these readings caught your attention and what was challenging/confronting/comforting about them for you?
- 6. As you read Matthew 1:18–25, what words or actions stand out to you that show Joseph's care or love for Mary, even before the angel speaks to him?
- 7. After Joseph hears God's message through the angel, what changes do you notice in how he responds to Mary and to the situation he's in?
- 8. In choosing to obey God and take Mary as his wife, what does Joseph risk or give up—and how does that help us see love as something costly or self-sacrificing?



The example of Joseph's initial response to the 'Mary' situation, is often considered as loving concern for Mary. While there may be some truth to this, this initial response, to 'deal with it quietly' also served Joseph's own interests. It would allow him to save face and also retain something of the reputation he might have had. But when God's plan is articulated and his promise is maid known Joseph responds differently. Not out of love for Mary necessarily, but out of love for God and his promises.

- 9. What does Joseph's initial plan reveal about the pull of self-protection or managing appearances, and how does that contrast with the kind of love God calls him into?
- 10. Where do you see the difference between acting out of human love (or self-interest) and acting out of trust in God's promises and His love in your own life or relationships?
- 11. In what ways does Joseph's obedience foreshadow the kind of love Jesus ultimately shows—love that lays aside personal comfort or status in order to fulfil the Father's will?



**MAKE IT REAL:** As we sit with Joseph's story, we're reminded that God's love doesn't just shape what we believe—it reshapes how we live. Joseph's response shows us that love grounded in God's promises moves beyond self-protection and convenience and becomes a way of life marked by trust, courage, and obedience. Christmas invites us to receive that same love in Christ and to consider how it might take shape in our own decisions, relationships, and daily choices. With that in mind, let's turn to what it means to live out this love purposefully in the places God has placed us.

- 12. Where might God be inviting you to move from self-protection or comfort toward a more courageous, obedient kind of love this week?
- 13. Is there a place in your life where loving someone will cost you something—time, reputation, comfort, or convenience—and what would it look like to trust God in that space?
- 14. What is one small, faithful step you can take this week to reflect God's self-giving love—at home, at work, or in your community?
